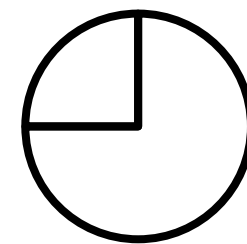
Characteristics of Patient Population Managed by Fellows

Average number of outpatients managed by fellows

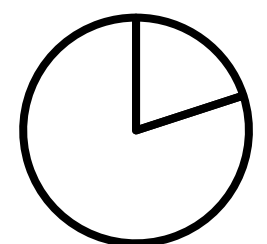

Patient panel were men.

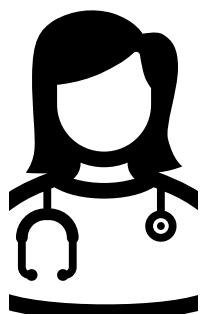
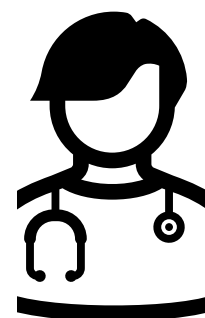


Knowledge, Skills and Experience Gained or Increased During Fellowship Year
